We were formed in 1990 as a company with charitable trust status and governed by a board of directors who are senior representatives from both education and business sectors.

CEBP has an excellent reputation linking schools and colleges with the business community and supporting young people in acquiring positive attitudes through work-related learning.

This is achieved through the delivery of a variety of programmes which develop young people's understanding of the world of work

whilst enhancing their employability skills.

All our projects and activities are delivered with the support of the business community with whom we have a very positive relationship.

Our team of staff offers a friendly and welcoming service, bringing to the brokerage and relationship management of education business liaison a breadth of professional knowledge and expertise.

Business partners can support young people on their '**journey to work**' through their commitment and participation in CEBP's

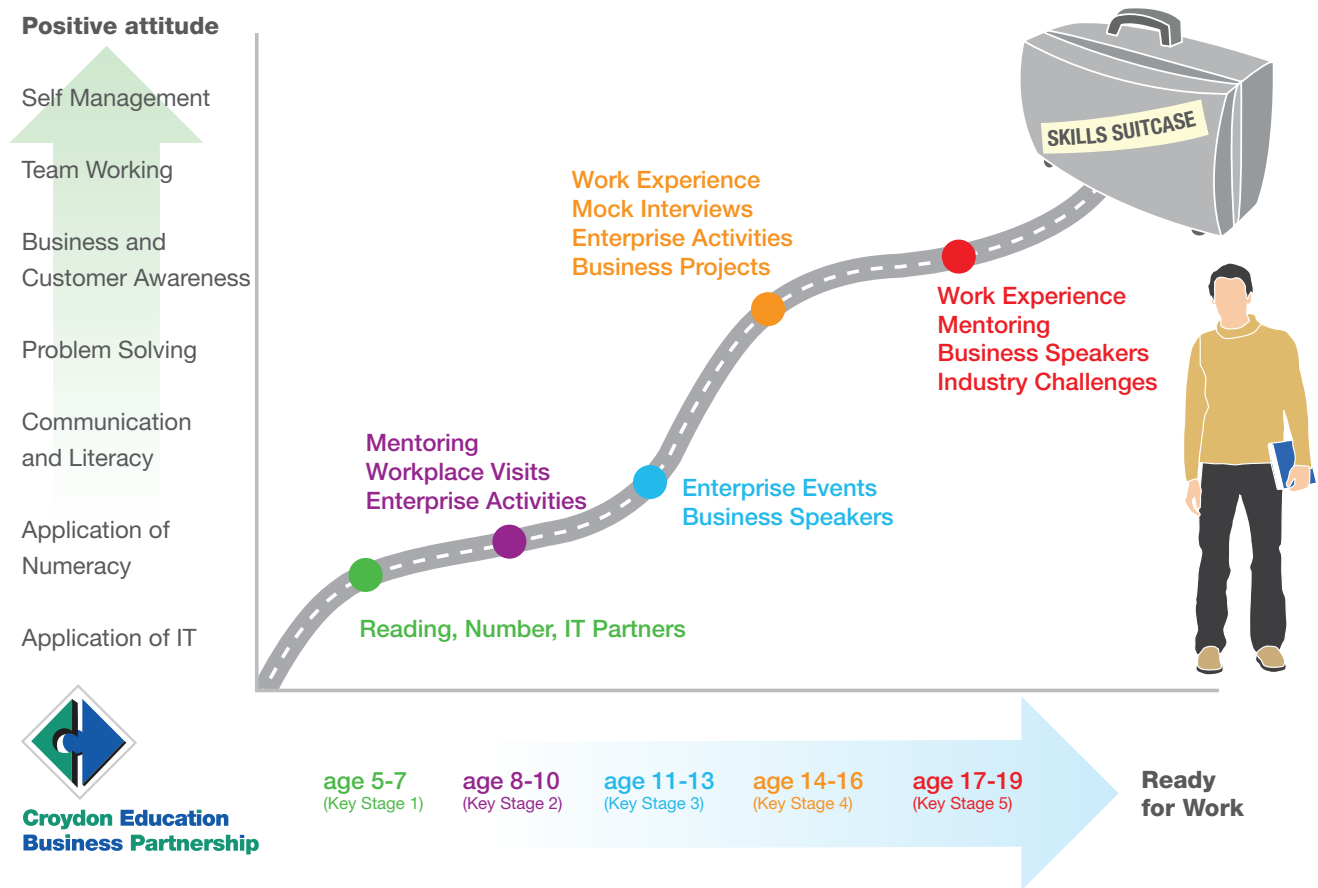
programmes and activities that offer opportunities to learn **for work, through work and about work**.

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Work Experience
